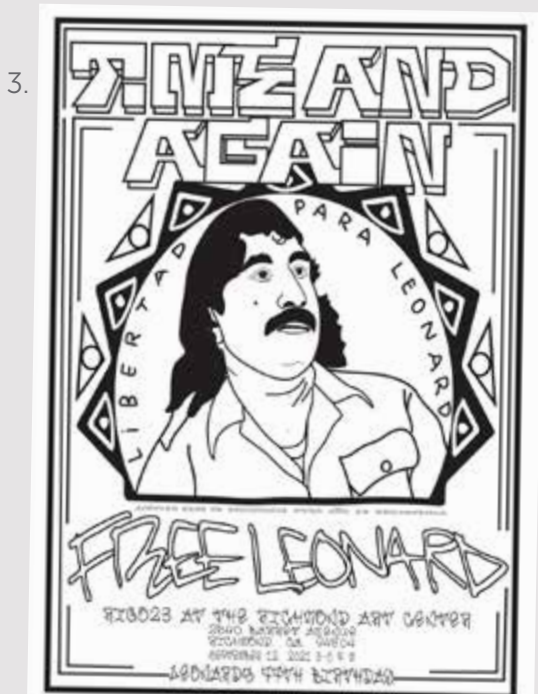

Twelve feet tall, Rigo 23's monumental statue of Leonard Peltier sits at the center of the exhibition anchoring a narrative of Leonard Peltier's 45-year long incarceration. For the first time, the sculpture is presented alongside photographs, letters, artwork, posters and ephemera from Rigo's archive.
