<u>Fencelines</u> is a community-based participatory art project that invites local folk to reflect on the circumstances of environmental injustice in Richmond, CA. The exhibition is centered around portraits of community participants and aims to amplify the work of local environmental justice organizations and provide opportunities for visitor participation and discussion.


Central to <u>Fencelines</u> is a public art installation along a city-owned fence bordering the Chevron refinery and the North Richmond residential neighborhood immediately downwind of it.
